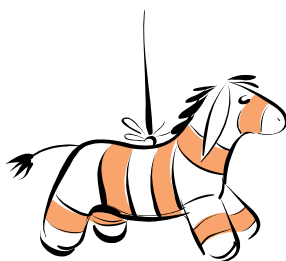

## Spanish Pāniora Year 8 Programme of Learning



This is a half year introductory language course. The main topics studied in this course include:

- Greetings
- Introducing yourself
- Exchange personal information (such as age and birthdays)
- Numbers
- Colours
- Family and pets
- Traditional festivals and celebrations

All the skills (listening, speaking, reading and writing) are practised but there is a strong emphasis on spoken interactions and role plays with partners in the class. Students will begin to build up their vocabulary using online programmes. For all aspects of this course, language and culture will be intertwined.

Through this Spanish course, students start learning how to engage with the world around them in appropriate ways and become global citizens. As students acquire the skills of both communicative and intercultural competence, they reflect simultaneously on their own personal identities and explore their own culture(s) from a new perspective.

Students are encouraged to use their own cultural kete to enrich their learning of Spanish. Students will discover and make connections to the rich history, customs, and cultures of the communities in which Spanish is spoken. Students will also have opportunities to make linguistic and cultural connections with Mātauranga Māori. Students are also encouraged to work as a team and support each other in their language learning experience.
